


The Marquee venue for these events is the front garden at 2 Skimmingdish Lane, Caversfield, Nr. Bicester, Oxon, OX27 8UF

June 4th - July 2nd, 2017, every night except Wednesdays 8.00-9.00pm on week nights, 6.30pm-7.30pm on Sundays





## The Bible's influence can be seen in art, science, medicine, music, education and much more...



Did you know that **John Newton**, the man who wrote the hymn Amazing Grace, was a close friend of the MP William Wilberforce? Newton was a slave trader before he became a preacher of the Gospel. His words and encouragement helped Wilberforce, who also was a believer in the Lord Jesus, form the resolve to put an end to slavery in the British Empire. They and many other Christians worked tirelessly until legislation was passed that ended slavery throughout the Empire.

Did you know that **Sir James Y. Simpson**, the scientist who is called the discoverer of chloroform, was greatly inspired in his research by what he read in the Bible and that he defended himself against

his critics by quoting the Word of God? He also recorded what he felt was his greatest discovery. He said, "MY GREATEST DISCOVERY, WHICH I MADE ONE CHRISTMAS DAY, IS THAT CHRIST IS ABLE TO SAVE TO THE UTTERMOST ANY MAN WHO IMPLICITLY TRUSTS HIM." Near the end of his life he said, "I am a sinner needing a Saviour, and Jesus is the Saviour I need."

Did you know that the world-renowned artist **Rembrandt** was so greatly inspired by the Bible that he painted or etched over 800 works of art on Bible themes? He painted himself into many of them, as the prodigal son who had so greatly sinned, as a frightened passenger in the boat with

the disciples and Christ on a stormy sea, and, most notably, as a figure at Calvary when the Lord Jesus was crucified.

Did you know that **Johann Sebastian Bach**, one of the world's greatest composers, said that "The aim and final reason for all music should be nothing else but the glory of God and the refreshment of the spirit"? On many of his compositions, he wrote the letters J.J. at the beginning and S.D.G. at the end. They are abbreviations for the Latin, Jesu Juva (Jesus Help Me!) and Soli Deo Gloria (To the Glory of God Alone!).
